





The State of Trust in the US-German Partnership: A Transatlantic Survey

Summary Report 2024

A WAKE-UP CALL

Public trust in the German-American relationship is lower today than it was two years ago - Percentage of Americans / Germans who trust the partnership

58%

(down from 63% in 2022)

48%

(down from 66% in 2022)

Lower trust in the partnership is more evident among Germans...

31%

feel skeptical about the partnership (up from 19% in 2022)

33%

feel worried about the partnership (up from 16% in 2022)

Optimism about the partnership's future has waned since 2022...

45%

think the partnership's best days are ahead (down from 55% in 2022)

20%

think the partnership's best days are ahead (down from 46% in 2022)

...whilst uncertainty has increased

don't know whether best days are ahead or behind (up from 27% in 2022)

27%

Violence, socio-economic instability and misinformation drive the growing distrust in each other



Americans' top 4 reasons why they distrust Germany

- The rise of extremist political **parties** (26%)
- The growing lack of willingness to reach compromise and consensus (19%)
- **Media misinformation** (18%)
- Germany's reliance on imported energy (16%)



Germans' top 4 reasons why they distrust the US

- Incidence of gun-related violence (62%)
- Attack on the Capitol on January 6, 2021 (50%)
- 3 **Media misinformation** (43%)
- The growing lack of willingness to reach compromise and consensus (42%)


TRUST IN BUSINESS SETS HIGH STANDARDS TO DO MORE

Business

Need to be **more transparent** in how they deal with each other (65% US; 71% Germany)

Should work together to strengthen military defense and economic **security** in democracies (68% US; 67% Germany)

METHODOLOGY:

15-minute online survey

MARKETS:

US and Germany

FIELDWORK:

• 2022 Wave 1: May 2022

2024 Wave 2: March 2024

SAMPLE DEFINITION AND SIZE:

Nationally representative samples of the general population in terms of age (18+), gender, and location in the US and Germany

- Total base size in 2022: n=4,003 respondents (n=2,002 in the US and n=2,001 in Germany)
- Total base size in 2024: n=4,000 respondents (n=2,000 in the US and n=2,000 in Germany)
